20 years ago there was a group of senior citizens who met to share stories, play games and enjoy each other's company. They would meet at the Fenton Township hall and other locations that would meet their needs. This group came together because they had a like interest in being with people they had known for a long time and had formed fond memories of days gone by. It became a big part of their lives and filled a void of emptiness.

The Loose family saw a need for a permanent location that the senior community could call home. Giving a gift of \$300,000 allowed this group to purchase the Free Methodist Church compound and developed a Senior Center. The small group then began the task of fixing and sprucing up the buildings and the grounds to make a senior community that others would attend. This group then organized committees and an executive board to establish by-laws and policies. Throughout the infant stage and early days, this group stayed together to form the backbone of leadership that set the course for Loose. They became the first set of volunteers that all successful organizations need.

Now, 20 years later, Loose has over 5100 members, 185 programs, and a new building which houses the daily need for our aging population. We have become one of the brightest and respected Centers in Michigan. This could only have happened because people had a vision and a goal to create a place that all could come and enjoy. Because of their hard work and dedication, Loose affords services, activities, trips and events to fill the needs of the membership. This dedication and hard work will have to continue from current and new members to fill this need. People will have to step up and take on roles that will allow Loose to provide the many services that exist today and those provided in the future. Without this commitment and dedication from its members, the task of continuation and growth becomes difficult and puts a strain on those already giving of their time.

So, as we plan for the next 20 years of Loose, we must understand the responsibilities of each member to carry on the passion and dedication of those who made it possible in the beginning. We owe it to them and the next generation of senior members to continue to work together to make Loose the best it can possibly be.
